## Implementing Wise Practices

By working together to address challenges to tackle existing health disparities, Indigenous peoples and allies can network together and utilize a system full of wise practices to conduct research and monitor progress data on HIV, TB, HCV, and STBBIs.

## Wise Practice Recommendations

1. Operate through a decolonized lens. An indigenous worldview is paramount.
2. Promote self-management that build self-determination.
3. Seek new and innovative way to shift the paradigm by using a human rights and intersectional approach to break down barriers to access to health care.
4. Build national and international alliances that contribute to the good health of Indigenous peoples.
5. Share ancestral knowledge in a way that benefits Indigenous peoples.
6. Provide resources to Indigenous communities so that they can develop and implement processes that address their health priorities.
7. Identify wise practices that contribute to the good health of Indigenous peoples and communities.
